

Information for international partners of a potential future work camp with the Evangelical Youth Association in Wuerttemberg (Evangelisches Jugendwerk in Württemberg)

aims	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Bringing youth from Germany and usually one other country together to share and learn from each other• Contribution towards strengthening and encouragement of churches and Christian youth work• Helping Churches or Christian Youth Associations for construction of buildings (or other projects)• Giving youth the chance to develop and use practical skills and by that giving them pride in what they have achieved together
age of participants	usually 18-26 years
number of participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• about 10-22 from Germany• if possible a similar number of participants from the hosting group
Expectations towards participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• openness towards other cultures and different types of spirituality• readiness to work manually (usually from 7.30 am – 1 pm)• technical skills are helpful but not expected
duration of work camp	usually two weeks (Saturday to Saturday)
preferred date	usually during school holidays in Baden-Wuerttemberg/Germany (between end of July and mid September)
Programm during the work camps	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Morning devotion / liturgy• Work on the construction site (usually from 8am – 1 pm)• Sharing meals together• Sports activities, cultural activities• trips and sightseeing (in the afternoons and on week ends)• Creative bible study groups, discussions on lifestyle and values, activities that promote intercultural learning• Attending of and contribution towards church worship services• Bonfire, singing, etc.• program is adjusted according to expectations of participants and local possibilities
